








1800 - population est. 3-5 billion birds

1813 - flight along Ohio River darkens sky for three days. "The dung fell...[like] melting flakes of snow," said J.J. Audubon.

1871 - mass nesting in OH; 850 sq. mi., over 136,000,000 birds

1878 - last mass nesting in MI; 10,000,000 killed

1895 - last nest & egg found in wild

1902 - last wild one shot

Main Ideas

Man vs. nature ideology - fear of natural world; it is to be conquered & molded into something new

Ordained right - God supports expansion of nation; ends justify means

Earth's bounty is endless - impossible to exhaust the resources of the nation

Competition - Natives must be defeated; progress won't happen by itself
